



#### Issue

Climate migrants are fueling a migration surge at the southwest borders.

Under international law, climate migrants are not granted refugee status.

With no legal status as refugee, there is a lack of adequate resettlement system and insufficient protection for climate migrants.



### Options

# Option 1: Advocate for a resolution granting climate migrants refugee status.

- Pro: Existing structures, mobilize global support
- Con: Potential obligations

## Option 2: Explore resettlement strategies in shrinking populations.

- Pro: Offer integration programs
- Con: : Host countries may be hesitant due to cultural barriers

# Option 3: Introduce a climate-specific Temporary Protected Status (TPS).

- Pro: Legal Pathway to the U.S.
- Con: Only Temporary and security issues
