



The Central America Migration Team will examine the drivers of migration – the factors that push people to abandon their homeland and that pull them to the United States – and analyze how the policies and programs of the United States, regional governments (El Salvador, Honduras, and Guatemala), and their partners could better address those causes.

## **KEY QUESTIONS**

- What factors *push* populations to migrate to the United States? What factors *pull* them?
- What roles do economic forces, demographic and environmental changes play in the current migration trend from the North Triangle and Mexico?
- What is the impact of the state of the social fabric, the growth of transnational and homegrown violent groups, and the role of immigrant communities in the U.S. on migrant flows?
- How are the United States, Central American governments, and Mexico addressing the migration problem, and what primary gaps exist in current migration policy?
- What role does Mexico play in the migration flow? How has Mexico responded to the crisis?
- How well does local civil society help to mitigate the migrant flow, and how can they be empowered to do more?
- What is the private sector stake in the migration crisis and how can they interact on the issue?

## **GOAL**

To produce actionable recommendations for the U.S., Central American and Mexican governments, NGOs, and the private sector to address the migration problem.
